Transaction Privilege Tax Changes and News

TAX CHANGES

City of Winslow

The city electorate passed Proposition 426 on November 3, 2020, which extends the levy and collection of an additional one percent (1.00%) city transaction privilege tax.

The Council of the City of Winslow ordained the extension of privilege tax with the passing of Ordinance Number 1359 on March 23, 2021 for an additional period of five years from July 15, 2021. Ordinance Number 1359 amends Article VII, Additional Tax, on each of the taxable categories listed in Article IV of the Tax Code, with the exception of those categories in Sections 9-422, 9-432, and 9-447. Ordinance 1359 shall cease on or after July 15, 2026 unless reauthorized by the qualified electors of the City.

Effective July 1, 2021.

TPT Filing Frequency and Due Dates*- Monthly and Quarterly

TPT filers are reminded of the following *March* TPT filing deadlines:

- April 20 TPT return due date
- April 29 Paper returns must be received by ADOR by 5 p.m. on this date
- April 30 Electronic returns must be received by ADOR by 5 p.m. on this date

DID YOU KNOW

TPT Filing Facts

- Check your business' balance or outstanding liabilities by logging into AZTaxes.gov. Select the account, then click "Pay," and "Pay Outstanding Liabilities."
- Verify and update your mailing address instantly and securely at AZTaxes.gov.
- Remember to file your TPT return for the prior month's activity.
- File a \$0 TPT return for temporarily closed businesses and residential rental property owners with no sales/or tax due. Go to azdor.gov/transaction-privilege-tax-tpt for more information.
- Keep your account history in good standing and avoid penalties. If no longer in business, cancel your existing TPT license on <u>AZTaxes.gov</u> or submit a <u>Business Account Update Form</u>.
- The tax rate look up tool on <u>AZTaxes.gov</u> is a useful tool for TPT filers in helping them find the TPT rates for any location within the state of Arizona.
